As many of you are aware we run a morning club on a Tuesday and Thursday morning from 8am called FunFit.

We would like to encourage more children to take advantage of this and therefore have a great offer for next half term. "2 for 1" If you buy a pass for one of the sessions you can attend the other session for free. There are 6 weeks left until Easter. A pass for the rest of the term will cost £15. A family pass for 2 or more children is £30. Alternatively it remains at £3 per session. (if you have already paid for the term please see Miss Hicks who can sort out a refund.)

FunFit is a programme which aims to improve motor co-ordination and underlying postural stability and balance in children. Activities will also help to improve eye-hand co-ordination, body awareness, spatial awareness and ball skills. The activities are based on typical motor skill development. They have been chosen to help improve the first and second stages of motor skill development i.e. foundations of movement skills particularly postural control and co-ordinating both sides of the body together, and the fundamental movement skills including jumping, hopping, skipping, balancing which together provide a foundation on which fine motor skills can develop.



Keyboard lessons.

We do now have space for some new pupils (Year 3-6) to take keyboard lessons with Mrs Thomas on a Wednesday afternoon. We also have a keyboard available to buy in the school for £35.
