Another great week for the children

Pre school have had another busy week. They went on a walk and looked for signs of autumn. They have also read Percy the Park keeper story and been outside with gardening tools.

Class 1 this week had a lovely visit from a past pupil who attended the school over 60 years ago. Thank you to Thelma Balsdon who showed us some fabulous photographs and shared some really interesting stories of her days at Warbstow primary. They have also been writing thank you letters and working very hard on their subtraction skills.

Class 2 this week have completed their time travel to the stone age leaflet, they have also made great progress on club 99. On Wednesday Class 2 learnt all about internet safety. They are now all looking forward to starting their new subject "Town Mouse, Country Mouse."

In the mornings Year 4 have been learning to recognise symmetry in 2D shapes and to reflect shapes over a mirror line, while the Year 5/6's completed their work on 2D and 3D shapes and moved onto learning the compact method for calculating multiplication problems. In literacy they have all written instructions for mummifying a fish using imperative verbs. Class 3 had an exciting Monday afternoon burying their mummified fish in the wild area. In PE the boys have continued developing their netball skills, while the girls took part in football coaching with Plymouth Argyle.
